Data

- From 2005-2013, there were 763 children ages 0-8 involved in a motor vehicle crash (MVC) transported to a trauma center in Nevada
- 53% were unrestrained
- Rural vs. urban

CPS Technician Certification and Recertification

- 32 hour certification course (3.5 days)
- Certification is for 2 years
- Requirements for recertification:
 - 5 car seat installations checked by a CPS instructor
 - 6 continuing education units
 - Participation in 1 community event or education session
 - \$50 recertification fee

CPS Technicians in Nevada

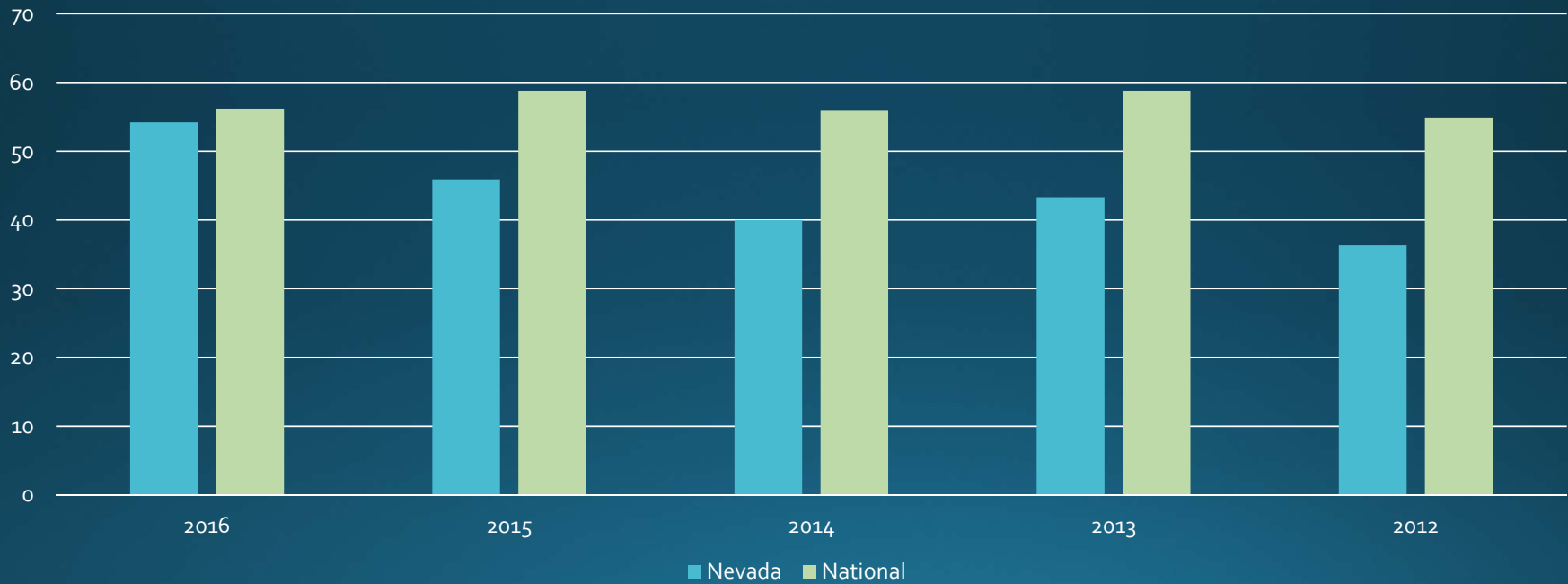
- At the end of 2016, there were 196 certified CPS technicians
- 74 new technicians were trained during 2016
- 45 CPS technicians recertified during 2016
